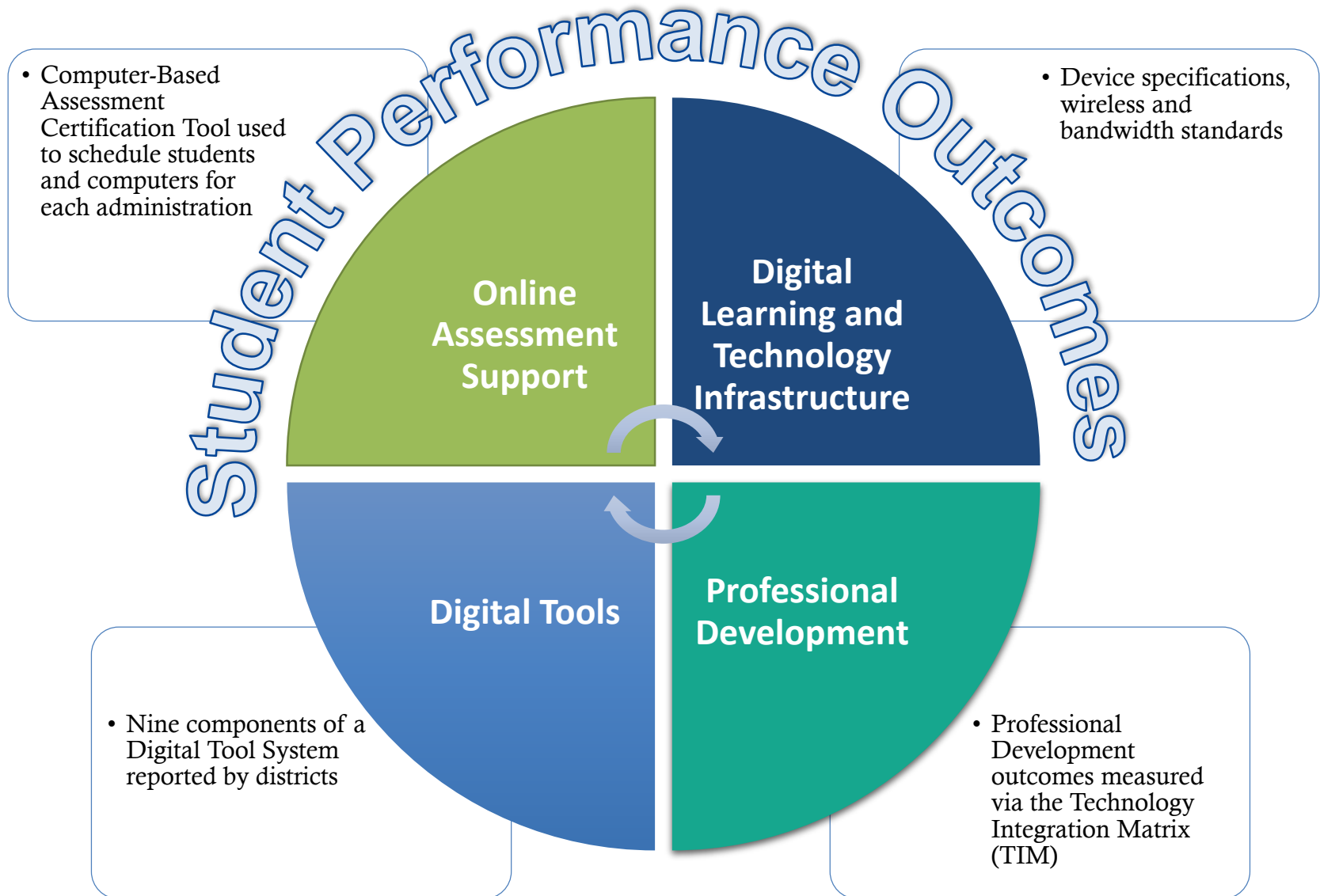

Recommended Bandwidth Specifications

2014-15 Year Target

100 kbps per student external internet connection

State Collaboration

- The Department of Education is collaborating with the Department of Management Services (DMS), and the Agency for State Technology (AST) to identify purchase agreements that districts can use for technology goods and services.
- DOE will make the agreements accessible and communicate the potential uses with districts.



Section 1006.40(3), Florida Statutes

- Beginning with the **2015-2016** fiscal year, each district school board shall use **at least 50 percent** of the annual allocation for the purchase of **digital or electronic instructional materials** that align with state standards included on the state-adopted list, except as otherwise authorized in paragraphs (b) and (c).

DCP Reporting s. 1011.62(12)(e), F.S.

- Districts reported progress on Digital Learning through the Technology Resources Inventory (TRI)
- Report was published by FDOE October 1, 2015

2015 General Appropriations Act (GAA) Specific Appropriation 90

- From the funds provided for Instructional Materials, \$165,000,000 shall be available to school districts to purchase instructional content as well as electronic devices and technology equipment and infrastructure.
- The purchases made in the 2015-2016 fiscal year must comply with the minimum or recommended requirements for instructional content, hardware, software, networking, security and bandwidth and the number of students per device as developed and published by the Department of Education.

GAA

- If the district intends to use any portion of the funds for technology, the district must:
 - certify to the Commissioner of Education it has the instructional content necessary to provide instruction aligned to the adopted statewide benchmarks and standards.
 - include an expenditure plan for the purchase of electronic devices and technology equipment and infrastructure that demonstrates the alignment of devices and equipment with the minimum or recommended requirements.
